Childhood and Family

The real name of Mahatma Gandhi is Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi.

He was born in Porbandar on the 2nd of October, in 1869.

His parents were Karamchand Gandhi and Putlibai. The former was the Chief Minister of Porbandar at the time.

Since child marriage was quite prevalent in that era, Mohandas Gandhi's marriage was also planned around the time he was 13 years old.

He was married to Kastur Kapadia, who later changed her name to Kasturba Gandhi after the marriage. They were married in the year 1883. Kasturba was 14 years old then.

Even after marriage, Kasturba continued to stay with her parents at her own home. Kasturba Gandhi, too, was politically active through her life and focused on attaining civil rights for everyone.

Mohandas Gandhi and Kasturba Gandhi had 4 children. All of them were boys. Their names were Harilal, Manilal, Ramdas and Devdas.

In 1885, Gandhi-ji and Kasturba had their first baby, which did not survive and passed away just a few days after birth. In the same year, Karamchand Gandhi passed away as well, leaving Mohandas fatherless.

As wonderful as he might seem today, Mohandas Gandhi was a weak student in school.

Work in South Africa

After completing his initial education, Gandhi made his way to London in order to study law. His aim was to become a barrister, which was also what his family wanted for him.

He studied law in the University College of London in the year 1888. After that, he returned back to India, making attempts to start his own law practice.

When those attempts did not bear any fruit, he decided to take up a job with a law firm. That job is what brought him to South Africa.

In that period, South Africa was facing a lot of discrimination along the lines of race and colour. Gandhi, hailing from India, also had a dark coloured skin.

While riding a bus that was filled completely, a white man asked Gandhi to vacate the seat he was sitting in, just because he had a dark coloured skin. Gandhi refused to do so and, as a result, he was thrown out of the bus.

Along with that incident, there were various instances where Gandhi was refused a room in the hotels of South Africa as well as ordered to remove his turban by a court magistrate as well.

All of these moments inspired him to fight for equality and develop political ideas that could help people.

Mahatma Gandhi and Indian Freedom Struggle

On returning to India, he realized how the Indian populace was

suffering under the British Empire. He decided to lead a movement with the aim to have an independent nation. The key strategy of his political ideas was the use of non-violence. Gandhi always believed that violence was never a solution to any problem.

He began undertaking numerous campaigns, revolving around the idea of civil disobedience. The streets soon filled with people boycotting their work and refusing to cooperate with the British. Similarly, Gandhi also conducted the Dandi march when the British imposed a heavy tax on salt. While Gandhi was elected to be a member of the Congress party in the year 1920, he later walked out of the party in 1934 and continued to work towards India's independence struggle by himself.

With repeated boycotts, disobedience movements, and nationwide rallying of the people with the "Quit India" movement to overthrow the empire, the British finally conceded and agreed to leave India, making it independent.

Detesting Gandhiji's staunch support for Hindu muslim unity Nathuram Godse a fanatic Hindu shot him dead on 30th January 1948.

In the years since Gandhi's death, his name has been invoked by the organizers of numerous demonstrations and movements. However, with a few outstanding exceptions—such as those of his disciple the land reformer Vinoba Bhave in India and of the civil rights leader Martin Luther King, Jr., in the United States—those movements have been a travesty of the ideas of Gandhi.

September Author - AGATHA CHRISITIE



Agatha Mary Dame Clarissa Christie DBE 15 September 1890 was an English writer of crime stories. Her books are very famous all over the world, and she sold more than 4 billion books around the world. Only William Shakespeare and the Bible have sold more books.

Also, her books are written in more languages than any other writer's books. People can read them in 103 different languages. Her stories are about murders and finding out who did them. It is hard to find that person.

There is a detective who tries to catch the bad person. People like reading her books because they can try to find the answer, too. Reading these books is like playing a game. The most well known

characters in her books Miss are Marple and Hercule Poirot. Miss Marple is an old English lady, and she talks to everyone. People do not think she is smart, but she always finds the bad person. She uses logic to find out who is guilty of the murder. Hercule Poirot is a strange man, a private detective from Belgium who lives in London.He likes to find out who did the murder by thinking about all the evidences. The stories of Poirot and Miss Marple were made into many TV shows and movies.

Christie also wrote plays. One of them is called The Mousetrap, and it started over 60 years ago. It remains the world's longestrunning play. Christie learned how to read by herself when she was four. She read many books, so she learned to become a good writer. She later became a very good pianist and singer, too. She was married twice; she had a daughter called Rosalind Hicks. She worked a hospital and in a pharmacy during

World War I. She also wrote romance novels and plays. They were very successful too. In 1971. she was honoured by the Queen with the title Dame Commander οf the Order of the British Empire. Christie died on 12 January 1976 at age 85.The Guinness World Records ranks Christie as the bestselling novelist ever.Her books have been translated into many languages. Christie's best-selling novel is And Then There Were None. It has sold 100 million copies. It is the world's best-selling mystery novel.

BRAVE COMMANDER & VEERA MANGAI KUYLI-THE FIRST SUICIDE BOMBER-



Kuyili was born in the 18th century at Kudanchavadi, near Sivagangai district. Her mother was also known for her bravery and is said to have died while fighting with a wild bull to save her fields from being destroyed. Kuyili was a devout commander of Velu Nachiyar and repeatedly saved her life.

On one such occasion, when she discovered that her Silambam teacher was actually a spy, she took action to save the queen immediately. On another occasion, when the queen was attacked during her sleep, she attacked the enemy and injured herself in the process.

Seeing her loyalty and bravery, she was made the commander-in-chief of the women's wing of her army. Kuyili later played an important role in the Sivaganga expedition of the queen.

Kuyili is known for her suicide attack in 1780. While attacking a fort of East India Company, she applied ghee on her body, set herself ablaze and jumped into the armoury of the East India Company, securing victory for Velu Nachiyar

The Tamil Nadu government has erected a memorial to Kuyili in the Sivagangai district.
