

### Gabriel García Márquez



Gabrielle José de la Concordia García Márquez, also known as Gabo (March 6, 1927 – April 17, 2014) was a Colombian novelist, shortstory writer, screenwriter, and journalist.

Márquez was born in a small town in Colombia, Aracataca. He originally studied to become a journalist.

He began writing at the age of eighteen. His first books were based on his life. He was best known for his novels *One Hundred Years of Solitude* (1967), *The Autumn of the Patriarch* (1975) and *Love in the Time of Cholera* (1985). His books were mainly about satire, solitude, magic realism, realism, and violence.

He won the Nobel Prize in Literature in December 1982. The reason was "for his novels and short stories, in which the fantastic and the realistic are combined in a richly composed world of imagination, reflecting a continent's life and conflicts"

Márquez wrote his last book in 2004. He retired in May 2008 because of his age and health. Since 2012, Márquez was sick with Alzheimer's disease. He lived with his wife, Mercedes Barcha in Mexico City. Márquez died on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2014 in Mexico City from pneumonia. He was 87 years old.




### **FEMINISM**



#### **SCIENTIST OF THE MONTH - ALBERT EINSTEIN**



## e=mc<sup>2</sup>

- 1. Albert Einstein was born in Germany on 14 March 1879.
- 2. Einstein's parents were both <u>Jewish</u> and he had a younger sister called Maja.
- 3. Although he apparently didn't like school, **Einstein** showed he had a great mind for maths and science from a young age.
- 4. When he was just five years old, his father bought him a compass. His enquiring mind immediately started trying to work out just why the needle always pointed north!
- 5. When Einstein was 15, his family moved to Milan in Italy. From there he attended the **Polytechnic Academy** in the Swiss city of Zurich.
- 6. In 1900 Einstein graduated with a degree in physics and maths.
- 7. Einstein began to make his mark after he took a job at the **Patent Office** in Bern, where he looked into other people's inventions. While he was there he worked on his own discoveries and found out many things that became of great importance in the world of physics.
- 8. Einstein is probably most famous for his 'theory of relativity' and the equation he made famous, e=mc², which proved that even the smallest amount of mass (basically the stuff that's in everything!) can be turned into a huge amount of energy.
- 9. In 1921 he was awarded the NOBEL prize for Physics
- 10. Einstein lived in Germany during World War 1 but he was a **pacifist** this meant he didn't believe in war and violence and wanted disagreements to be settled peacefully. In 1933 he moved to the USA.
- 11. On April 18 1955, Albert Einstein died at the age of 76 from heart failure.
- 12. In 1999 he was named Person of the Century by Time Magazine.
