This event was held on 29th of August, organized by KG coordinators in order to enhance the creativity skills among students. Our school Correspondent and Principal also joined us and made this event successful.

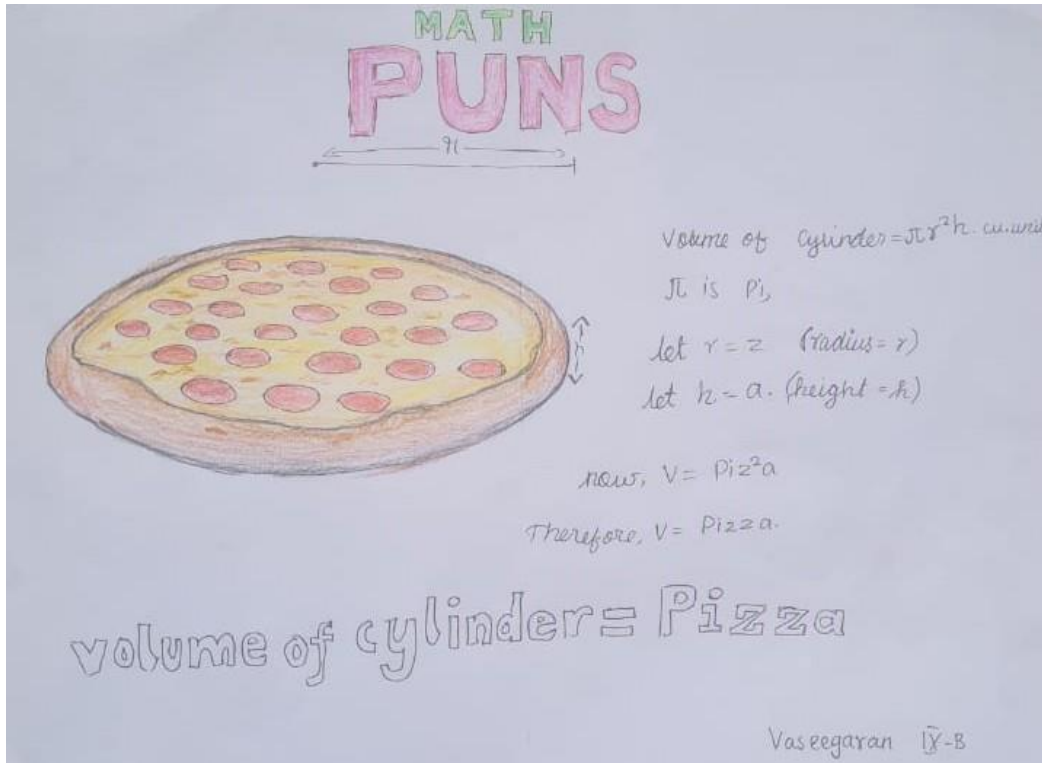


Sports Day

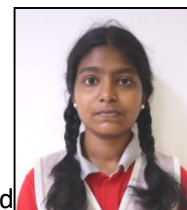
